GUIDELINES FOR AUTHORS

Submission, assessment, acceptance and corrections

- > Manuscripts can only be submitted via the Online Manuscript Submission, Review and Tracking System Editorial Manager under the following web address:
<https://www.editorialmanager.com/euin/>.
- > Papers can only be handed in on condition that they have not yet been published or submitted for publication elsewhere. Furthermore the publication must have been approved of all authors of a working group. Also, the paper, if it is accepted, must not have been submitted for publication in the same form elsewhere without the approval of the copyright holder – neither in the same nor in another language.
- > Scientific and technical original papers and reports from the fields of electrotechnics and information technology qualify for publication in e&i.
- > Original papers can be submitted in German or English, reports (rubrik Praxis+Wissen) can only be submitted in German.
- > Manuscripts can only be handed in on condition that they are correct regarding both, linguistics and content.
- > Each manuscript from the fields of original papers is evaluated by at least two different experts. Manuscripts belonging to the category "reports" will not be evaluated.
- > Galleys of original papers are sent to the main author. Regarding the galleys, only typographical errors may be corrected. As regards content or style there must not be any alterations. Costs for later alterations which exceed 10 % of the costs of typesetting will have to be paid by the author.
- > In order to facilitate quick publication the correction of makeup will be done by the editor.
- > The editor reserves the right to make formal and stylistic alterations as well as to shorten the text.
- > With the acceptance of a paper the author gives Springer-Verlag the exclusive, locally and temporally unlimited right to reproduce and distribute the article. Also all translation rights are given to Springer-Verlag.

Organization of content

- > The subject should be treated in an application-oriented way, to be comprehended not only by few experts, but by a broad public.
- > Emphasis should be put on a concise and exact presentation. The title of the manuscript should be as short and expressive as possible.
- > Set-up of the paper: Original papers are to be divided into introduction and approach of the problem, methods and discussion as well as summary and conclusion. Reports (practical topics, science) may be structured in a different way.
- > Introduction and approach of the problem: State of the art and aim of the paper should be described in a comprehensible way in a few lines.
- > Methods and discussion: The specialized component of the paper should be developed and new ideas that justify the publication as original paper should be pointed out.

- > Summary: Besides other consequences effects of the paper on technology, production, etc. as well as impact on economy and practice are to be described.

Formal organization of manuscript

- > Texts have to be written according to the rules regarding Webster's Dictionary.
- > All sheets including bibliography and legends have to be numbered.
- > **Size**
- > Original e&i papers should comprise five printed pages at most including figures and tables (i.e. approximately 21,000 strokes). Longer manuscripts may be published charging a contribution to the cost of printing. Surveys should be limited to a maximum of two printed pages (i.e. approximately 8,000 strokes).

General issues

First sheet of manuscript:

1. Short and concise title of the paper
2. Names of all authors (first name, family name, academic degrees, profession, title and, if need be, department as well as membership of technical-scientific associations as e.g. OVE, IEEE, VDE/ITG etc.)
3. Authors' place of work including address
4. Footnotes regarding title (indicated by asterisk)
5. Address of the main author for correspondence with editorial and publishing house including phone number, fax number and e-mail.

Second sheet of manuscript:

1. Summary (40 to 50 words both, in German and English)
2. Title in German and English
3. Three to five keywords both, in German and English
In general, the author takes the responsibility regarding the correct text, however, if necessary, there will be linguistic corrections done by the editor.

Text:

The text has to be divided into sections and, if necessary, subsections with concise titles; numbering has to be done according to the decimal system according to ÖNORM A 2720 (1., 2., ... 5.1, 5.2 ...).

Mark up for setting can be done in italics and should be underlined.

Figures:

Figures should be reduced to essentials. Figures should be black and white. Coloured figures are possible, however, please note that extra expenses will be charged.

In case of labelling, the letters have to be high enough to be readable after reduction (mostly to the width of columns), i.e. at least 1.5 mm.

Figures should be numbered continuously and in any case kept separate from the text.

Captions have to be annexed to the end of the text. They should be short, but adequate.

> **Formulas:**

Mathematical treatises should be presented as shortly as possible; derivations, as far as they are indispensable, are to be shown in an annex.

Equations have to be marked by successive numbers (1), (2)... next to the right margin. They have to be written in such a distinctive way that misunderstandings are excluded, especially when Greek letters are concerned.

For the individual formula sizes and units there have to be chosen designations that correspond to the measuring and gauging law and to the standards.

Intermediate calculations are to be left out in general. Examples with numbers should be limited to the statement and the results.

> **Tables:**

Tables are to be numbered with Arabic numerals independent of figures. Furthermore, there should be headings to the tables.

Number tables should only contain the main values for greater intervals. Numbers that can also be gained through interpolation are to be left out.

> **Footnotes:**

Footnotes have to be characterized by serial superiors.

> **Acknowledgement:**

is to be put at the end of the paper before the references.

> **References:**

The references should only contain relevant quotations.

Only papers that are mentioned in the text are allowed in the bibliography.

The bibliography has to be ordered alphabetically according to the first author's name. The following data has to be cited:

1. Names and following initials of all authors
2. Year in brackets
3. Full title of work
4. Additional information regarding books: volume and edition, page, place of publication, publisher
5. Additional information regarding periodicals: shortened title of the periodical, volume of year, issue or fascicle number, first and last page of the paper

Regarding papers that are being printed the periodical in which they are going to appear has to be indicated. Papers that are not yet being printed have to be quoted as "personal information".

Regarding references that appear in the text author's name and date of publication (in parenthesis) have to be indicated.

Papers of authors that have appeared in the same year are distinguished by a, b, c, etc. behind the year.

If there are more than three authors only the first one has to be mentioned with the additional remark "et al."

Stimmer, H., (1989): Elektrotechnik im Wandel der Zeit. e & i 106, nr. 5: 189-194.

> **Information about the author/s:**

At the end of the article each author is presented in a short biography as well as a photograph.

> **Formats and structure of data:**

> Texts should be handed in in Microsoft Word. They should not contain any specific formatting like grouped style, bold print, centring, etc. For positioning please use tab stops instead of blanks. Also, please neither use field functions (except for equations), layout and style models nor heading resp. footing lines. Make use of a common typeface.

Pictures are to be sent as tiff-files, graphic data (graphs etc...)

should be sent as eps-files (best quality regarding jpeg-compression).

Pictures and graphs of Microsoft Office products as well as of any presentation programmes (e.g. Powerpoint) are usually not to be used for printing.

Illustrations and graphs should not be integrated in the text – please don't send imbedded files, but text files, image files and diagram files apart.

Files of non-PC-compatibles can only be accepted after consulting the editor.

> **Adjustments:**

Coloured images and graphs: CMYK-mode, for 1:1 figures use a resolution of 300 dpi.

Grey tones: for 1:1 figures use a resolution of 240 dpi.

Graphic data: bitmap-mode, for 1:1 figure use a resolution of 800 dpi.

Pictures that are used in the world wide web for the reason of illustration usually have a resolution of only 72 dpi, hence they are not to be used for printing.

Author's copies and offprints

> The main author of original articles is supplied with free author's copies: 5 for papers with one author, 10 for two authors, and 15 for three and more authors. Authors of reports get 1 gratuitous copy.

Additional offprints that will be charged can be ordered, however, they have to be ordered when the galleys are returned. Price list and order form are sent to the author together with the galleys.
